## Time to register for NACE Edmonton conference

Plans are shaping up for the 2008 Northern Area Western Conference, 'Gateway to the Oilsands', hosted by NACE Edmonton Region.

Edmonton is the major hub for supplying technology and services to the Alberta Oil Sands. The conference will provide an excellent opportunity to explore innovations and ideas for dealing with the challenges of developing this vast resource.

The conference will take place at the Shaw Convention Centre and adjacent Marriott Hotel in downtown Edmonton from February 11-14, 2008. The conference will feature:

**Registration fees** for NACE members are:


- Full Conference - \$350 plus gst

## Corrosion in everyday life - Questions and answers

### What can I do to prevent corrosion in my vehicle from road salts in the winter?

The use of de-icing salt on icy roads has dramatically increased in cold regions since it was introduced in the first part of the twentieth century.

However, while there are safety benefits to using de-icing salt, it is extremely corrosive due to the disruptive effects of chloride ions on protective films on **metals**. Here are a few winter vehicle protection tips to consider from the

#### **Corrosion Doctors:**

- ▶ Prevent rust by keeping the underside of your car clean. Place a lawn sprinkler (or hose) under your car and turn on full blast. Move occasionally so it will reach all areas. This is a good way to remove all salt and road grime.
- ▶ If you chip the paint on your car, clean promptly and apply touch-up paint or clear nail polish to the area.
- ▶ If the carpet in your vehicle is subjected to a lot of salty water over the winter, rust could be forming where you can't even see it, underneath the carpet. A good rug shampoo, either a do-it-yourself project or professionally done, will help remove the salt from the carpet fibers. Be sure to clean the upholstery too.

## CP Certification for Alberta

The cathodic protection (CP) industry - through its working groups, the Petroleum Services Association of Canada (PSAC) Cathodic Protection Committee and the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training (AAIT) Provisional Advisory Committee (PAC) - is currently pursuing Designated Occupation status from AAIT for two levels of the profession.

To date, the skills and tasks associated with Cathodic Protection Technician, Levels 1 and 2 have been outlined. These will serve as the basis for the application which will be submitted to AAIT this spring, pending the results of a survey that has been initiated to define who does CP work in the province.

Currently, companies engaged in the maintenance of rectifiers must be granted an Authorization to Work by AAIT, a permit that must be applied for and is issued annually. If the application for Designated Occupation status is successful, an annual permit system will no longer be required and, more importantly, a career path will have been created for individuals in the cathodic protection industry.
